- 3. TRAINING/GROUP DISCUSSION (20 minutes):

Topic: "CenterPointe Hospital" (Clint Schulte) – Has a 28 day residential program that is very 12 step focused, as are all their programs. Takes commercial, private, and Medicare insurance. There is support in an outpatient setting- could be 3 half days a week but could even have full day supports. There are 3 outpatient locations- St. Peters, Cedar Plaza off Tesson, and one off New Ballas Rd. There is no set rule before taking a patient who has been sober for a certain time frame; that is a case by case basis. Has one inpatient facility in Weldon Spring. The length of stay for the inpatient program is one week. Adolescents 12-17 can be taken at their inpatient and outpatient facilities. Currently do not have residential program for adolescents. Once a week they have a family group that is free for any family of someone who is in one of their programs. They also have a once a week after care program that is also free and is free for life once someone has been in one of their programs. If you have a referral, call the admissions/referral line to get the fastest response!
