- 3. TRAINING/GROUP DISCUSSION (20 minutes):

Topic: "SCCAD Meeting Updates & Narcan in the Field" (Rock Township – Stephanie Franklin) – Stephanie is showing an overdose in the eyes of a paramedic (she has been an EMS for 38 years & paramedic since 1983). Narcan for lay people can be terrifying to the paramedics because they know how they are trained to deal with waking people after overdosing and are unsure if those administering know what can happen. Also the Narcan paramedics are using is a significantly lower dose that what lay people are using. Another alarming issue for paramedics and the public is that there is longer lasting oral and transdermal opioids that can out last Narcan. Rock Township took a look at the trends of different drugs, and then looked at the trends of the antidotes they use for those drugs and those antidotes are no longer available for use by the paramedics due to different events. So what will happen with Narcan?

Stephanie and Rock Township need the help of the coalition members and bridging the gap of what can be done to help people who are overdosing on opioids/heroin/etc. They want to wake people from an overdose state in a better calmer way, and they don't want to have to fight them (because they can be combative). Here are skills: recognizing the signs (pinpoint pupils, unresponsive, drowsy nodding, decreased breathing, etc), what do I do? (call 911!- good Samaritan law, support with rescue breathing, Narcan-could need multiple doses), Why rescue breathing (brain injury occurs within 3-5 minutes of insufficient breathing).
